Next year

Where does that leave us for the next year? What do we mean by next year? These are my thoughts:

Summer season

- 1. We should have a summer season, either every 2 or 4 weeks, starting in May, free of charge
- 2. For the summer season, more content and organisation responsibility needs to be taken by the membership, with the rest organised by myself and Melanie

Next season

- 1. I believe we should offer a hybrid meeting for next season.
 - This means it would take place in a hall or online, or both
 - The speaker or judge could attend in person or online
 - The membership would have the choice of attending in person or online

So, for example, if we are able to meet in person in 2021, we would meet in Sandgate library, which has excellent internet. Those who wanted to attend in person, could, and those wanting to stay at home, could join via Zoom, broadcast from Sandgate.

- 2. The hybrid format allows us to get excellent speakers again, but I do think we should have around 2-3 internally led presentations. (I do not mean image presentations, but talks and teaching)
- 3. The last Monday or thereabouts will be an outdoor meeting
- 4. There was a questionnaire carried out in May/June last year. This is available on the website. We, as a committee, will be guided by this questionnaire. This means:
 - Roughly speaking, the competitions for next season will stay as they are, (although there is to be 1 less round due to timings), as the current format was given a significant thumbs up
 - The themes will come from the submissions in the questionnaire
 - We will try to arrange outings to places in the questionnaire
- 5. Due to uncertainty, we will keep the subs at £15/half season

3. Other

We are not a large club and really need about 40 members to function well, so we will be trying to recruit members. We did make contact with other clubs in the area as we thought there might be synergies to be achieved together but this was not very fruitful

Boulstone was a victim of lockdown, and do we do hope to re-start this initiative which should culminate in an exhibition of prints, hopefully at the Kent Battle of Britain Museum Trust in Hawkinge.
